

- 3 All cloths and cake covers (where used) will be removed from exhibits prior to 8.45 on Saturday 30 August.
- 4 ALL exhibits in Vegetable, Fruit and Flower Classes MUST have been grown by the exhibitor, with the exception of the Floral Art Classes. The Show Committee reserve the right to request a visit to the exhibitor's garden.
- 5 Classes 1-27 & 33 will be judged according to The National Vegetable Society's Judges and Exhibitors Guide, second edition, first amendment.
- 6 ALL entries in Home Produce and Floral Art Classes MUST be the work of the exhibitor.
- 7 Restrictions to numbers of entries per exhibitor, per class in some open vegetable classes and all Novice Classes – see relevant sections.
- 8 Entry fee 25p per entry (cash only). Children's classes free.
- 9 Exhibitors may reserve their own exhibits mark the blank side of the entry cards clearly with the letter R. ALL reserved items not removed after presentation of awards will be auctioned.
