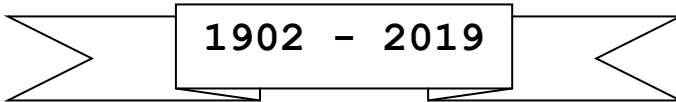

SCHEDULE

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. ALL exhibitors in Classes 1-68 must be fully paid up Members of the Society or a direct relative of a Member. All other Classes are open.
2. ALL exhibits in Vegetable, Fruit and Flower Classes MUST have been grown by the exhibitor. The Show Committee reserve the right to request a visit to the exhibitor's garden.
3. ALL entries in Home Produce and Floral Art Classes MUST be the work of the exhibitor.
4. ALL exhibits to be entered on Friday 30 August between 5.30pm and 8.45pm and staged by 9pm.
5. Entry fee 10p per entry. Children's classes free.
6. Exhibitors may reserve their own exhibits at an additional 20p each. No reserve is necessary on Floral Arts exhibits. ALL reserved items not removed after presentation of awards will be auctioned.
7. Exhibits and prize cards MUST NOT be removed from display until awards have been presented.
8. Points awarded in ALL classes: 1st – 3 points, 2nd – 2 points, 3rd – 1 point
9. Any objections to the Judges' decisions must be lodged in writing by 2pm on the day, to the Show Secretary, after which the matter will be discussed by the Show Committee

RECIPE: 6oz Margarine, 6oz SR Flour, 6oz Caster Sugar, 3 Eggs, pinch Salt.
Raspberry jam filling only.
86. Jar of Home-made Curd, minimum 300 g (* see note below)
87. Jar of Home-made Marmalade – minimum 300 g (*see note below)
88. Jar of Home-made Chutney (to be allowed to mature prior to Show)
89. Cake made with fruit or vegetables from your allotment or garden (NEW CLASS)
90. Six Jam Tarts – short crust pastry
91. Shortbread Ring. 7/8" approx.
92. Fruit Cake. Prize money - 1st - £3.00, 2nd - £2.00, 3rd - £1.00. (Winner will also receive the Ingrid Dickson Trophy, kindly donated by family and friends)
RECIPE: 8oz Bero Flour, 4oz Sugar, 4oz Margarine, 2 Eggs, 3 tablespoons Milk, 8oz Fruit, half teaspoon Mixed Spice, 2 tablespoons Syrup.
