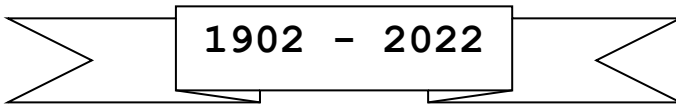

# SCHEDULE

## CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. All classes are Open
2. ALL exhibits in Vegetable, Fruit and Flower Classes MUST have been grown by the exhibitor. The Show Committee reserve the right to request a visit to the exhibitor's garden.
3. ALL entries in Home Produce and Floral Art Classes MUST be the work of the exhibitor.
4. Exhibitors may enter only one exhibit per class in Open Vegetables Classes 28-32 and all Novice classes
5. ALL exhibits to be entered on Friday 2 September 2022 between 6.00pm and 8.45pm and staged by 9pm.
6. Plates and vases are provided
7. Entry fee 20p per entry. Children's classes free.
8. Exhibitors may reserve their own exhibits by marking their entry cards clearly with the letter R. ALL reserved items not removed after presentation of awards will be auctioned.
9. Exhibits and prize cards MUST NOT be removed from display until awards have been presented.
10. Points awarded in ALL classes: 1<sup>st</sup> – 3 points, 2<sup>nd</sup> – 2 points, 3<sup>rd</sup> – 1 point
11. Prize money 1<sup>st</sup> - £1.50, 2<sup>nd</sup> - £1.00, 3<sup>rd</sup> - £0.70 except where stated.
12. Any objections to the Judges' decisions must be lodged in writing by 2pm on the day, to the Show Secretary, after which the matter will be discussed by the Show Committee

- 72. Jar of Home-made Curd, minimum 300g (\*see note below)
- 73. Jar of Home-made Marmalade – minimum 300g (\*see note below)
- 74. Jar of Home-made Chutney (to be allowed to mature prior to Show)
- 75. Six Jam Tarts - short crust pastry
- 76. Fruit Cake. 20cm/8”tin (Winner will also receive the Ingrid Dickson Trophy, kindly donated by family and friends)

# FLORAL ART

## ALL FLORAL ART CLASSES - OVERALL THEME- OUT AND ABOUT

Accessories are permitted but fresh plant material must predominate

- 78. Recycled – An exhibit featuring an unusual/repurposed container (\*)
- 79. The Arboretum – an exhibit featuring fresh foliage (\*)
- 80. High 5 – An exhibit incorporating five blooms
- 81. Stately Home – an exhibit depicting an aspect of the National Trust (\*)
- 82. The Kitchen Garden – An exhibit to include vegetables and/or fruit (\*)
- 83. The Seashore - A petite arrangement not exceeding 9"/23cm in width and depth. Height optional

(\*) No final measurement to exceed 2ft/60cm for height, width and depth in classes 78, 79, 81 and 82

Prize money 1<sup>st</sup> - £1.50, 2<sup>nd</sup> - £1.00, 3<sup>rd</sup> - £0.50, 4<sup>th</sup> £0.25

Age limit 14 years and under. Age to be stated on entry card. Age will be taken into consideration when judging

- 84. Decorated Flower Pot, maximum 5"/13cm
- 85. Miniature Garden, maximum size 9" x 15"/ 23cm x 38cm
- 86. Small vase of cut Flowers
- 87. Decorated paper plate
- 88. Animal, Bird, Fish or Insect made from fruit or vegetable and or fruit/vegetable material
- 89. Four decorated Fairy Cakes
